When I called the company to ask about getting replacement parts, they sent me a brand new sharpener. All they asked was for me to send a couple photos showing the damaged part and the serial number. This was long after it was out of warranty."

Dean Duwa, Ainsworth, Iowa: "My best buy was the 492 **New Holland** mower conditioner I bought in 1993. I've also had a New Holland square baler since 1973. Both of them were always dependable.

"However, this year I bought a 109 New Holland disc mower which cost me an extra \$ 2,740 in repairs before I could get 40 acres mowed. They would not stand behind it. I'm done with New Holland; they won't get another dime from me."

Jeffrey Helmuth Saugerties, N.Y.: "Porter-Cable electric tools are weak, the batteries don't last or break, and underperform in every way."

Lawerance Krantz, Moran, Mich.: "My best buy is my 1942 Farmall H. I use it for plowing and disking my small farm.

"I also have a 1983 **Troy-Bilt** tiller that still runs well, and my 2010 **Ford** F-150 truck has 300.000 miles."

Gary Adams, Humboldt, Iowa: "DeWalt power tools are high quality, powerful, versatile, and a good value.

"Strutmasters Ram Air-Ride to spring kit is easy to install."

On the negative side, "The 2014 **Dodge** Ram 1500 with hemi is a 'recall special'. The Air-Ride was the worst part. I replaced the air-ride with a Strutmasters spring kit. The dealer has been no help whatsoever with anything. The engine runs poorly. It has a poor AC and heat system. The manifold studs break constantly. I think the cam is going out also (I believe they are well known for that)."

David Mertell, Independence, Mo.: "It's not a 'buy' but about 6 mos., ago at the age of

95, I was given a pile of rusty old iron by a good friend. It was a **Farmall** 240 high crop with no tires. I've been working on it and have great experiences with acquiring parts from Steiner Tractor, Jim's Tires in Sedalia, Mo., Amazon.com, and others. Right now it's in my carport waiting for the last step of the rebuild. It's been a fun project."

Ken Gilbertson, Ada, Minn.: Ken's "best buy" is a 2020 Vermeer Signature Series 4 by 5 round baler. "There have been no problems in 2 years of use. I really like the camless pickup. Starting a bale is fast and easv."

Jon Otts, Carastota, N.Y.: Jon's pleased with his 2019 Stihl MSA 160C battery-powered chainsaw. "My sons bought it for me for Christmas. Keeping it sharp is the secret. I've cut all of my firewood with it this year. The battery lasts 45 min. to an hour. When the battery quits, so do I because, at 82, an hour a day at the woodpile is plenty for me."

Allen S. Andrews, Gillett, Penn.: "Hart tools and vacuums have worked out great for me. I bought them at Walmart over the past year or two. Many Hart brand products are made in the USA and have a lifetime guarantee.
