Handy New Tarp For Trucks, Wagons

You don't have to do any climbing to roll or unroll the new EZ Roll tarp for trucks, semis or wagons.

To unroll it, you simply grab a long crank, which reaches to the top. Several turns of the crank roll the tarp off to one side and lay it in a special cradle for transport.

To re-cover the load, you grab a rope and pull the tarp back over the top of the truck box. It unfolds in accordion fashion and is tied down with built-in straps.

All tarps, made of 14 oz. nylon with polyurethane coating, are 8 ft. wide and available in 16 to 40 ft. lengths.

A 16 ft. long tarp, complete with straps, sells for \$500. The package includes tie rods which go over the top of the box (5 ft. apart) to hold the tarp off the grain load, and a front headboard which keeps wind from getting under the tarp and which also drains rain water off to the sides so it doesn't puddle on top of the rolled-

A 24 ft. long EZ Roll Tarp sells for \$580, and a 41 ft. for \$800.

HYDRAULIC POWER UNIT AND ENGINE CAN BE TAKEN OFF AND USED FOR OTHER JOBS

This Log Splitter Also Crushes Cans

Here's a log splitter with something different — a can crushing attachment that turns 5 gal. cans into flat disks. What's more, the unit's self contained engine and hydraulic power unit can be detached in seconds for use anywhere you need hydraulic power, such as for augers, truck hoists, or whatever.

The hydraulic Schweiss Wood Splitter splits wood with 38,000 lbs. of push at 3,000 psi. The 4 in. dia. cylinder comes with 24, 36 or 48 in. stroke and features automatic high speed return after splitting. The unit, available in both tractor or self-powered models, has no belts or pulleys. Self powered models are operated with a 4 hp. Clinton or Briggs & Stratton gas engine. Direct drive with a 6:1 gear ratio yields 8 to 10 hp.

"With our power amplifier, designed for tough wood, we can split wood that our competitors can't manage using larger 16 to 24 hp. motors," says Harold Schweiss, manufacturer.

The optional can crusher is a flat plate that bolts to the splitter just ahead of the splitting wedge. According to Schweiss, it crushes 5 gal. herbicide cans down to 1½ in. thick.

The engine and hydraulic unit attach with just 4 bolts for quick, easy removal for use on other jobs, such as operating augers, or for truck or trailer hoists. The hydraulic power unit can also be used with an 8 hp. engine to operate a Hesston or other brand of stack mover.

The tractor-powered Wood Splitter

sells for \$580. The self-powered model, complete with a 4 hp. gasoline engine, lists at \$839. The optional can crusher attachment costs \$45.

GET SHOCKING RESPECT FROM HOGS

"Blitz Board" Sorts Stubborn Livestock

"It's especially suited for sorting and handling confinement livestock," says Robert Jones, inventor of the new electrified Blitz Board for "manipulating" stubborn livestock. "It combines the best of an electric prod and a plywood sorting panel."

The Blitz Board is 24 in. wide, 30 in. high, ¾ in. thick and weighs only 10 lbs. It's equipped with 3 easy grip handholds. The center grip has a squeeze-type trigger which activates the panel's built in electric shocker. If a stubborn animal needs a bit of prodding to get it going in the right direction, just push the panel against the animal and pull the trigger. You'll get instant and shocking re-

spect, thanks to the Blitz Board's built in "hot shot" system which is powered by 6 Cell batteries. The electric "shocker" unit and grid system is built into the urethane panel which is waterproof to a degree in that you can use the panel to sort hogs in the rain, according to Jones. "It shocks with about the same jolt as a 6 volt livestock prod." he explains. "With the trigger switch, the batteries last a long time since they're drained only when the trigger is pulled."

Suggested retail is \$85.95.
