

Amazing New “No Wobble” Funnel

The first-of-its-kind “no wobble” funnel system is designed to make changing oil or pouring other liquids a much easier and faster job.

The WonderFunnel holds steady so you can pour more easily with virtually no spills. The system comes with interchangeable parts and numerous adapter attachments, allowing it to be used as a regular funnel, hose funnel, barrel funnel, or Secure Lid funnel.

“I offer nine different WonderFunnel kits, so there’s something for everyone from mechanics to cooks,” says inventor Dale Hester.

FARM SHOW readers will probably be most interested in his 10-in. farm and ag large funnel kit with hose. The 10-in. funnel is big enough to hold both 1-gal. and 5-quart oil containers.

“This funnel comes with a long tip that screws onto the bottom of the funnel. As a result it won’t dislodge as easily as most large funnels on the market,” says Hester. “The kit also comes with a screw-on 5/8-in. dia. by 26-in. long clear hose for hard-to-reach places. The hose may be cut to shorter length if desired. However, the funnel’s threaded bottom will accept any garden hose of any diameter or length. Optional hoses for special applications are sold separately.

A barrel adapter can be screwed onto the bottom of the funnel, converting it from 3/4-in. garden hose threads to 3/4-in. pipe threads that fit into many 5-gal. buckets and most 16,

30 and 55-gal. drums. “Once in place, there’s no need to hold the funnel so you have both hands free as you pour out of the container,” says Hester.

Using the company’s secure lid, you can attach the funnel through the lid of virtually any container to create a solid, one-piece attachment.

The kit includes the 10-in. WonderFunnel with removable tip, 28-in. hose, removable screen washer, barrel adapter, and SecureLid. It sells for \$19.95 plus S&H.

Hester also offers a similar funnel kit with hose that lets you dispense 3 quart bottles at one time while changing the oil in your vehicle. A 3-wing divider snaps into place inside the funnel and is used to contain the bottles. A chain with a large S-hook at the top is used to hang the funnel from the vehicle’s hood latch, and 3 smaller snap hooks at the bottom attach to the funnel.

The oil change kit with a 10-in. funnel sells for \$24.95 plus S&H; with a 6-in. funnel, \$19.95 plus S&H.

“There’s much more to say. The easiest way to understand this product is to go to our website. Watching the 3 1/2-min. video will tell you more than I can tell you in a 15-min. conversation,” says Hester.

Vertical CNC Table Takes Up Less Space

Even a crowded garage, shop or work area has room for a CNC plasma cutting table if it’s a vertical unit from BurnTables. The full-size table takes up only a 26-in. strip of floor space, yet handles up to 60 by 60-in. sheets of material.

“Many people don’t have room for a full-size plasma cutting table, so we put ours on its side,” says Matt Kool, BurnTables. “You can use plasma torches, engraving pens or routers, both steel and wood. Just lay the edge of the material you are working in the holder, lean it against the grating and mount the cutting or engraving tool.”

The \$11,500 table and computer come complete with CNC controls and full CAD/CAM and Torch Control software. Drawings can be scanned and imported for use in cutting designs. The table itself is designed with no upper rails allowing completely open access. Carriers keep cables out of the way when loading material. The gantry offers full movement up, down and across the table,


including up to 6-in. depth control with all devices. Though designed for use with a plasma torch, the company also offers an air pen engraver, tube notcher and oxygen acetylene torch attachments.

The company makes horizontal CNC plasma tables as well. Kool says they originally designed the vertical table as a way to attract attention as they broke into an established industry.

“We needed a burn table for our own use, but found industrial style tables too expensive and hobbyist tables too lightweight or temperamental,” says Kool. “We introduced ours with industrial components, but it’s simple and easy to use.”

The vertical table has indeed attracted attention. What Kool didn’t expect was the broad spectrum of users it attracts. Instead of engineers and fabricators, buyers were as likely to be husbands and wives, both with plans for use.

“Our cutting table appeals to the OEM

Simple Fix For Faulty Case 1190 Power Steering

“Anyone who has ever owned a Case 1190 tractor and had the power steering go out knows that it’s almost impossible to find a replacement pump,” says Joe Victory, Culleoka, Tenn. “Then one day I was talking to my cousin, who’s a good mechanic, and he suggested that we look at replacing it with a pump from a car.”

His cousin checked the specifications from the 1190 pump and found that a pump from a 2000 Nissan Exterra had a similar rating. With that information in hand, Victory pulled a pump from a salvaged Nissan and devised a plan to mount it on the 30-year-old Case 3-cylinder diesel.

Victory says the salvaged pump was

about the same size as the one he pulled from his tractor, so the mounting brackets worked just fine. They changed out the pulley to match the tractor, adapted a new pressure line, and put on a new belt. “As soon as we fired up the tractor, the steering worked just like a new tractor,” Victory says. He’s used the tractor several months without any problems. Joe says he just checks the power steering fluid once in awhile and keeps a little extra automotive steering fluid on hand in case he needs to add some.

that had been outsourcing cutting needs,” says Kool. “However, it also appeals to the do-it-yourself market, including the small manufacturing company or shop that does custom cutting. We have a lot of customers in agriculture, sign shops and especially hot rod enthusiasts.”

Kool says the table has found special appeal with people with full-time jobs who want to start their own business on the side. The compact size makes it easy to fit into an existing shop or garage. The software lets users take a design off the internet and turn it into a final product.

“Customers describe making complete off-road buggies, including gussets, motor mounts, dashboards and seat pans, everything but the drive train and motor,” says Kool. “Others do signs or metal art for church bazaars or to sell at markets. Others make parts for dry ice and soda blasting equipment.”
