## **BUYING TIPS YOU CAN USE**

Randomly selected farmers "tell it like it is" in nominating their "best" and "worst" buys.

Mark Jacobs Associate Editor Philip Pudwell, Medicine Hat, Alb.: "In 50 years of farming, my worst buy was when I bought a Whizzer seed cleaner. I ordered it from JSX Rebel Industries, 600 Washington Ave. North, Minneapolis, Minn. I paid \$2,000 cash in U.S. funds on Jan. 26th 1984. With all the phone exchanges, and a trip to their office in Minneapolis, it cost me well over \$3,000, and I still have no seed cleaner. All I got was promises but no machine."

William Hodel, Roanoke, Ill.: "This phone never did work well very far from the base, even though it was advertised as having a 1000-ft. range. Now it cuts out while we're talking. I took it back and they gave me a new one, but it isn't much better," says William about his "worst buy" Cobra cordless telephone.

He's happy with his White 8-row, 30-in. planter. "I appreciate the simplicity of this planter. I've used it for two seasons with little downtime. It's accurate for seed population and depth at speeds up to 8 mph. I also really like our 6620 Deere combine."

John Hansen, Randolph, Neb.: John's pleased with his 1977 F-150 Campbell-Hansfeld airless paint sprayer.

On the "best buy" side, he's happy with his **Husky** snowblower and **Shaver** hydraulic post driver. "I've driven 45 posts in 45 minutes with the post driver. It's never needed any repairs."

Louis Roquet, Evansdale, Iowa: "My 'worst buy' was a Farmecon pipeline milking set-up with Bodmin milker claws. The pump runs backwards and throws oil all over. The milkers froze up in middle of milking, causing loss of milk and mastitis. The mechanics installed the electric components wrong and then charged outrageous prices for repairs. Service is poor."

Mark Lindberg, Fertile, Minn.: "Every time we use it we hold our breath," says Mark about his "worst buy", an 1800 4-WD Massey Ferguson. "It's been through an engine, transmission and front and rear axles all in one year, plus an electrical system, alternator and hydraulic system."

On the plus side, Mark's happy with his 1977 GMC 4-WD ½-ton pickup with a 350 engine. "In 150,000 miles I've only had to put in two clutches and one set of plugs. I use it every day and use it hard for spraying, and for pulling trailers and heavy loads."

James Richison, Mulkeytown, Ill.: "This truck is very well built. It hasn't had any service problems," says James, pleased with his 1984 Ford F-250 4 WD, diesel pickup. "The 6.9 liter engine has performed well and has good power and fuel economy.

"I also nominate my two 86 series International tractors and my 1460 Axial Flow combine as 'best buys'. All have excellent performance and dependability."

James isn't as happy, however, with his May-Wes folding auger hopper. "The hopper works for unloading gravity wagons but only with the auger at a low angle. When you try to use the hopper with an auger inclined at a normal angle, grain spills out."

Jerry Blackledge, Marion, Mich.: Jerry names his Century AC-DC welder as both his best and worst buy. "A part was missing so it didn't work. After replacing the part it works beautifully."

Donald Risser, Bainbridge, Penn.:
"They paid for themselves in the first
day of use because of the better
stand," says Donald, pleased with
Depth-A-Matic depth control arms
for Max-Emerge planters, manufactured by SI Mfg. Spencerville, Ohio.
"These stops drastically cut planter
unit bounce, especially in no-till and
minimum-till conditions."

Tom Noller, Stockton, Ill. "My 1984 Chevrolet Celebrity is a 'best buy'. It has a smooth ride and surprising power for a 4-cyl. engine. I'm also happy with my Homelite Super EZ Automatic chain saw. After six years of rough use and only a new fuel filter, it still starts and runs great."

Bob Van Roekel, Maurice, Iowa: "It takes the work out of cleaning hard packed manure off the floors of hog confinement buildings. Does a beautiful job," says Bob about his
