## “Down Corn” Harvester Salvages Loose Ears



“It’s the best down corn harvester ever built,” says a Minnesota farmer about his new down corn retriever which lets him recover loose ears and ears still attached to downed stalks. The “Corn Gleener” is built from a 30-ft. Case-IH 1020 grain header and mounts on a “beefed up” Case-IH 2166 combine. See story on page 2.

## Splitter Hitch Pulls Two Balers At Once



A Texas farmer and his son built a hydraulically powered splitter hitch to pull two Case-IH balers behind their Deere tractor. The hitch also serves as the hydraulic oil reservoir for pumps and motors used to drive the balers.

## Weigh Scale For Grain Drills



An Iowa farmer mounted electronic weigh scales under each corner of the grain hopper on his Deere 750 grain drill. “It lets me know how much seed is left in the grain tank at all times and is about 99.5 percent accurate in setting plants per acre,” he says. “This idea would easily adapt to other makes and models of grain drills.” Note the white scale units at each lower corner of drill.
