On the negative side, Lauris is unhappy with a "Chase electronic rodent repeller device that emits a sound from speakers at a frequency that rats dislike. Principle of the device may be good but I am using it in a hog barn and there is apparently too many places for the rodents to hide behind where the signal, which is line of sight, cannot reach them. Anyhow, it is ineffective."

Schweiss 6 by 16 ft. bumper stock trailer: "It's built to last. Can pull off stock rack in 5 min. and have a trailer capable of hauling equipment, hay or any other items not requiring stock rack. Also like hitch that is put on pickup to take the jar out of stopping and starting. Can haul 25 240-lb. hogs with ease with half-ton pickup. A real good bargain and priced considerably lower than other trailers." Bill Whiton, Perry, Iowa.
