Sweet Corn Relish

9 cups fresh sweet corn
1 cup chopped green peppers
1/2 cup chopped red peppers
2 cups chopped onions
1 cup sugar
2 tbsp salt
1 1/2 tsp celery seed
1 1/2 tsp mustard seed
1 tsp tumeric
3 cups cider vinegar

Combine all ingredients in pan and bring to a boil. Cover and simmer 15 min., stirring occasionally to prevent scorching. Ladle hot relish into hot, sterilized jars, leaving 1/4 in. headspace. Wipe rim of jar clean, place hot lid on jar and screw down firmly. Process in boiling water bath canner for 15 min.

Pepper Poppers

8 oz. cream cheese, softened
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
1 cup shredded Monterey Jack cheese
6 bacon strips, cooked and crumbled
1/2 cup dried bread crumbs
1/4 tsp salt
1/4 tsp chili powder
1 lb. fresh jalapeno or banana peppers

Mix cheeses, spices and bread crumbs together. Add bacon bits. Fill halved peppers with mixture. Either bake in oven or put on grill. Can be served with sour cream, onion, or Ranch dip.

Basil Chive Cucumber & Corn Salad

3 cups cooked kernel corn
2 cups cucumber, peeled and chopped
1/2 cup basil, chopped
1/4 cup chives, snipped
2 tbsp mayonnaise
Salt and pepper to taste

Toss together corn, cucumber, basil and chives. Stir in mayonnaise. Add salt and pepper. Store in a covered container in the fridge until serving time.

Cider Vinegar For Itchy Skin

Soak a cloth in equal amounts cider vinegar and water. Wring out and apply cloth to skin. For dandruff, apply cider vinegar to scalp before shampooing.

Stylish Women's Workwear Designed For Comfort

Some women feel "pretty in pink" so Rosies Workwear makes pink overalls that are stylish but also designed to fit women's bodies.

Sharon Moore, owner of the California company, started her journey to create workwear for women after wearing a pair of men's coveralls during a welding class. The knee-level crotch made it difficult to walk, and the too-long sleeves were unsafe for welding.

In June 2002, after research and working with designers, she started Rosies (named after those famous WWII female workers). Her online business now includes a variety of work clothes.

"Women practically live in them because they get used to the comfort," Moore says, noting that her clothing adjusts for different seasons and situations with a double button system on the sides to make the overall tighter or looser. That's helpful when it's cool and a sweatshirt fits under the overall. Loosening the stretch shoulder straps will even allow them to continue to fit during pregnancy and seasonal weight fluctuations.

Made with soft-brushed cotton twill fabric, the workwear has multiple deep pockets and kneepad pockets that hold optional light Neoprene pads. The overalls have zippers to transform them to long shorts.

"Many design features were originally suggestions from our customers," Moore notes.

"Our pink overalls are searched for (online) the most," Moore says. "It's just fun, especially for women in men's fields. They are working like a man, but want to look like a woman."

"Smoke," the newest overall, is water-resistant and also very popular, she adds.

The coveralls and overalls range from \$73-\$85. They, along with tool belts and gloves, are available through the website and a few retailers.

New Way To Roast And Bake

This new Karrsen Dome Oven holds up to a 22-lb. turkey, but can also bake a 12-in. pizza, pot roast, cake and just about anything else a conventional oven bakes. And it does it faster, keeps food moister and is energy efficient, says Joey Ober, executive vice president with Karrsen.

"What makes it different is that the dome oven has a heating element in the lid," Ober says.

With the dual-wall lid, the oven heats to 450 degrees in just 6 min. The all-around heating method speeds cooking time by as much as 51 percent. And since it only uses 1,150 watts and is well insulated, the oven doesn't put off as much heat or use as much electricity as other roasters or range ovens.

"We introduced it in March, and it has been very well received," Ober says. Ober adds that FARM SHOW readers who visit the company website and input discount code FARMSHOW2017 will receive a \$20 discount on the purchase of a Karrsen BR-2 Original Dome Oven & Roaster, which sells for \$100 to \$130, depending on model. "We are growing so fast that I hardly know what to do," says Fluffy Layers owner Tara Jane Grier.

From a single apron design, the business has grown to include half and full aprons, as well as 2 children's sizes and a multitude of other products, all in animal and garden themes. Grier even offers a waterproof grooming apron for working around horses. It comes with 3 large pockets for grooming tools and features a horse print design.

In addition to direct sales from the company website, products are carried in more than 200 farm and feed stores across the country, including several national chains. Grier also offers opportunities for Fluffy Layers Brand Representatives.

"Run your business via online pop-up shops, social media, local fairs, festivals and street markets," says Grier. "You decide your own schedule and hours, set your personal goals and explore new passions along the way."

Hassle-Free Drip Irrigation Kit

If you've got a few garden plants that need frequent watering, you might like this simple root-zone drip irrigation kit that sets up in minutes.

The "Deluxe Micro Snip-n-Drip Irrigation Micro Drip" kit comes with drip nozzles that apply water to 6 plants, and six 24-in. high stakes that hold the nozzles and support the plants. You use a scissors to cut the micro hose to the length you need and then insert the nozzles. Flow controls let you fine-tune the watering application rate.

The kit includes the 6 stakes, 25 ft. of 3/16-in. dia. drip hose, 6 drip nozzles with clips, a control valve, end cap, and faucet connector. The company says the nozzles are easy to clean and make the kit ideal for use in hard-water areas, where buildup of salts can clog other types of nozzles.

The system can also be fed by a rain barrel. The kit sells for \$24.95 plus S&H.

If you're looking for a more extensive system, go to Google and search "mini drip irrigation" and a lot of kits will show up to cover hundreds of plants at reasonable rates.
