"It's made of heavy-duty plastic and is open on both ends. You just insert a bag on one end and scoop into a sand pile with the other end, and then pick it up and remove the bag. It works with either wet or dry sand and can accommodate any size sand bag." Larry Shepler, Reynoldsville, Penn.:

Larry's the satisfied owner of a 2014 New Holland 7230 discbine. "This is our third New Holland discbine, starting with a model 411 and then a 1411. We've had great luck with all of them, but it's nice to see that as they get older they get better. Each new model seems to outperform the one before it. The 7230 mows and dries hay fast and is very reliable.

"Our 2015 Krone Swadro 42T 3-pt. mounted rotary rake is well constructed but hard to level, and it does a poor job when going through dips and hollows. It misses hay at the bottom of a dip, but unfortunately rakes in all the rocks on the edges. Our Vicon 423T rake follows the contours much better but is poorly constructed."

Allen Davenport, Godfrey, Ill.: Allen's the owner of a "best buy" 2017 Toyota Tundra pickup equipped with a 5.7-liter V-8 engine. "I owned a 2008 Tundra before and decided to upgrade. Both models are built well and pull like Clydesdale horses. One time I was able to tow a 12,870-lb. load more than 400 miles at 70 mph down the freeway with no problems. It gets 17 to 18 mpg empty and 9 to 10 mpg towing a 9,000-lb. travel trailer.'

William S. Mattox, Jasonville, Ind.: "I'm well satisfied with the 2017 3-pt. mounted, 8-ft. landscape rake I bought from Everything Attachments (www.everythingattachments. com; ph 866 581-5818). "I saw a YouTube video that showed how to use their rakes and was so impressed that I ordered one. I think it's the best landscape rake on the market. It can be used with either a Cat. I or II 3-pt. hitch and is rated for a 75 hp. tractor.

"I use my rake to level gravel and dirt, to do garden work, and to help clean up pastures. The rake is reversible, so if I want I can turn it around and push material with it. It'll push logs weighing up to 300 lbs. The company offers numerous helpful how-to videos on much of their other equipment, too. They also offer free shipping on almost every attachment on their website.'
