New-Style Trailer Jack Eliminates Common Problems

"Anyone who has a trailer jack that is weak or wobbly, or who is just tired of conventional jacks, will be interested in our new TripleQuick Jack," says Bernard Brandenburg, Bernie's FabWeld, Ash Flat, Arkansas.

The TripleQuick Jack is a sturdy triangular-braced jack that automatically lifts itself out of the way when it's retracted. "It has a quick-

drop leg so you don't have to crank it down every time you use it. Once you drop the leg, you just pin it in place and raise the load."

The footpad connects to two angled braces that come off the front of the trailer. "The triangular configuration of the bracing provides exceptional stability," says Brandenburg.

The pivoting jack rotates back as the jack

is raised to transport position. "The jack lays flat within the standard A frame so it's not in the way when stepping over the tongue," says Brandenburg.

The jack comes as a kit and requires minimal assembly and welding to install. Instructions are included.

Single and double drop models with up to 3,000-lb. capacity sell for \$200 and

\$225, respectively. "Custom jacks can be fabricated to match your trailer needs," says Brandenburg.

Grain Bin Cap Opens, Closes From The Ground

EZ Remote Bin Caps have been good sellers since they first went on the market in 1996. To open, just pull on the cable which runs down to ground level and release it to close.

"With standard bin caps, the wind can get under and open them up," says inventor Jerry Tufte, Tough-T Mfg. "Our tipping bin caps automatically latch when the caps come down under their own weight."

The tipping EZ Remote Bin Caps come with 30 ft. of 1/8-in. aircraft cable and other hardware. Heavy mounting rings make them easy to install. They come in 18, 24, 27 and 32-in. diameter sizes. Prices for the 4 sizes range from \$260 to \$370.

Sliding caps for larger bin openings operate with 2 aircraft cables, one for opening and one for closing. They are available in 36 to 44-in. diameter sizes and are priced from \$550 to \$600.

"The tipping caps come with rings that slip over the existing cap ring," says Tufte. "Just tighten set screws, drill some holes, and bolt them solid. The sliding caps require drilling a couple of holes and have a few more pieces to assemble, but they go together easily."

Both styles are easy to set to a vent position for use with aeration fans. Everything about

them is designed for ease of operation, says Tufte.

"Our customers like the convenience and the fact that they work well," he says. "We've had guys come back multiple times as they add new bins. They really like that they latch tight and stay closed."

3-In-1 Forestry Tool

The new LogOX 3-in-1 Forestry Tool combines 3 log handling tools in one – a log lifter, cant hook, and timberjack.

A unique cross handle design makes it easy to lift and load logs onto a splitter without bending over. It can also be used as a 21-in. cant hook to roll logs. By pinning on an extension, it can be converted to a 38-in. cant hook that will handle larger logs up to 32 in. in diameter. And by attaching a T-bar attachment to the cant handle extension, you've got a sturdy timberjack that can lift logs off the ground for cutting with a chainsaw.

The MultiTool measures 28 in. when disassembled and fits into a custom-made bag (sold separately).

Add-On Tailgate Lift For Utility Trailers

Raising and lowering a trailer tailgate is an easy job with the Gorilla-Lift. You just lower the tailgate with the touch of a finger and lift it by nudging it with your toe.

The 2-sided tailgate lift assist is designed for use on utility trailers with 10 to 24-in. high side rails and 4 to 6-ft. high tailgates. It can be used on tailgates weighing up to 300 lbs.

The lift assist consists of two 6-ft. lengths of 2-in. square tubing, which bolt onto trailer side rails. The 2-sided assist takes all the weight off heavy utility trailer tailgates or ramps, allowing you to raise or lower them with almost no effort. According to

the company, the system prevents uneven stresses and wear on both the tailgate and trailer.

An optional tailgate handle that rotates 360 degrees makes it even easier to raise and lower the tailgate.

The Gorilla-Lift tailgate lift assist kit sells for \$187 including S&H. The tailgate handle sells for \$55 including S&H.

Post Extensions From PVC Water Pipe

Wayne Beggs, Lincolnton, Georgia, found a low-cost way to lengthen his 6-ft. high electric fence by using short lengths of pvc pipe and short sections of T-post.

"The 6-ft. high electric fence surrounds my vegetable garden and over the years I've had problems with deer jumping over it," says Beggs. "I decided to add extensions to the posts using 1 1/2-in. schedule 40 pvc water pipe, which I cut into 12-in. lengths.

"I had some extra posts that were bent

up so I cut them up into 18-in. lengths, and then slid them down about 6 in. into one end of each pvc pipe. I slid the other end of the pipe over the 6-ft. post and then used plastic clips to attach the electric fence line. Now the topmost electric fence tape is about 7 ft. high. No more problems with deer getting into my garden."
