Cherry Cheese Pie

Pie Filling

11 ounces cream cheese
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
2 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Graham Cracker Crumb Pie Crust

1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs
1/4 cup brown sugar, packed
1/3 cup butter, melted
Topping
1 1-lb. can pitted tart red cherries
1/4 cup sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch

Preheat oven to 325 F.

Filling: Beat cream cheese until light and fluffy. Blend in 1/2 cup sugar and vanilla. Fold in beaten egg whites.

Crust: Combine all graham cracker crumb pie crust ingredients in a bowl. Mix until crumbly. Press evenly on bottom and sides of a 9-in. pie plate. Pour filling into crust. Bake for 25 mins.

Topping: Drain cherries, reserving 1/2 cup juice. Combine cherry juice, 1/4 cup sugar and cornstarch in a saucepan. Cook over medium heat until thick. Remove from heat and cool slightly. Arrange cherries over pie. Spoon sauce over cherries. Chill in refrigerator until serving time.

Slow Cooker Mashed Potatoes

5 lbs. red potatoes, cut into chunks
3 cubes chicken bouillon
1 tablespoon minced garlic
1 8-oz. container sour cream
1 8-oz. package cream cheese, softened
1/2 cup butter
Salt and pepper to taste

Place potatoes, bouillon and garlic in a large pot and cover with water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer until tender, about 15 mins. Drain in a colander over a large bowl, reserving cooking water. Mash potatoes with sour cream and cream cheese, adding reserved water as needed until creamy. Transfer mashed potato mixture to a slow cooker, cover, and cook on low for 2 to 3 hours. Just before serving, stir in butter and season with salt and pepper to taste.
