Crock-Oven: New Cooking Concept

The original Crock-Pot slow cooker started a revolution in the kitchen. Now comes a new cooking concept—the Crock-Oven from Rival Mfg., Kansas City, Mo.


With it, you can slow cook an entire meal for 8, 10 or 12 hours — without timing or tending. A low-watt element (200° on "Lo" and 300° on "Hi") encircles thick stoneware at the sides, top and bottom. Foods cook slowly and evenly in a "blanket of heat" to bring out the best in flavor and nutrition. No stirring or timing.

Rival's new Crock-Oven has no thermostat, no intermittent heat and no hot spots, the manufacturer points out. It's big enough to slow cook a giant roast, whole ham, standing rib or 10 to 12 lb. ham or turkey. Or an entire meal. Just plug it in, forget about it and come back 8 to 12 hours later to a perfectly cooked meal. All in separate pans with each food retaining its own flavor, texture and shape.

Crock-Oven fits right on the counter top and measures 12 in. high, 15½ in. wide and 11½ in. deep.

Best Christmas Tree Stand We've Seen

Natural Christmas trees don't dry up and lose their needles when kept in the Gunnard Christmas tree stand.

one of the best we've ever seen.

"Most Christmas trees brought into
the house and placed in our stand are
so moist after 4 to 6 weeks that you
can't even burn them," says John
Ahlquist, president of the Gunnard
Co. "They take up that much water,
which helps the tree hold its needles
and stay green and fresh throughout
the entire holiday season."

The pan-shaped base of the stand is 16 in. in dia. and holds 2 gals. of water. "Secret to its success," says Ahlquist, "is that it's designed to keep the foot of the tree constantly immersed in several inches of water. We've discovered that it's important to trim the bottom end of the tree straight across, with the bark on all sides extending all the way to the very end. If you whittle away the bark, you detract from the tree's abil-

ity to take up water naturally."

Another key feature is that the stand is sturdily built to support trees of any size up to about 8 ft. tall (larger models of the stand are available to handle large trees — up to 20 ft. or more — for churches, schools, offices, etc.). The four adjustable support braces can be positioned and screwed against the trunk of the tree without having to remove the lower branches and thus detract from the tree's appearance.

The stand, made of heavy, 21 ga. galvanized steel, is indestructible and corrosion proof. Model 16, designed for use in the home to handle Christmas trees up to 8 ft. tall, sells for \$13.50, including shipping and handling.

CUTS TO EXACT LENGTH DESIRED

Hair Cutting Device for Do-It-Yourselfers

"This device allows you to give yourself a professional looking haircut quickly and easily," says William Bahrno, inventor and manufacturer. "It measures and cuts to the exact length desired."

The device consists of a base, threaded shaft and a pair of specially adapted barber scissors. You simply swivel the scissors up or down the shaft to the desired cutting length, place the base of the instrument on your head, lift the surrounding locks of hair to the scissor, and cut.
