Collapsible Ladder For Fire Emergencies

It's easy to scoff at statistics and figure that fire only happens "to the other guy". But what would you do if disaster struck home — your home? Most families now have smoke de-

tectors, the first step in a two-part program of home fire protection. But what if fire blocks the halls or

stairway? What if your only escape route is a 2nd or 3rd floor window? "Firescape", a new emergency fire

"Firescape", a new emergency fire ladder from Rival Mfg., offers a ready way out. Fast, light and easy to use, it's available in two models — 15 or 25 ft. — and folds up for storage into a small, compact case for storage under a bed, or in a closet near an exit window.

Both models are made of 49 strand galvanized steel cable rated at 950 lbs. test. "This cable won't burn, rot or rust and is virtually indestructable. What's more, it doesn't kink or tangle like chain-type ladders," a spokesman for Rival Mfg. points out.

The emergency ladder requires no screws, bolts or clamps. It loops right over any sill. Individual rungs have a non-slip surface for secure footing even without shoes. Rings are made of reinforced, 11½ in. wide tubular galvanized steel. Galvanized steel "standoffs" are welded to rungs about 4 ft. apart to brace the ladder and keep it away from the wall for easier descent.

First Popcorn Popper For Microwave Ovens

New from Amana Refrigeration is the Radarange, billed as "the first microwave oven popcorn popper".

It pops 2 to 3 qts of popcorn in 3^{1/2} minutes and requires no oil, shaking or stirring.

Because popcorn kernels don't readily absorb microwaves, heating ordinary popcorn in a bag or regular dish can cause problems, explains Fred Streicher, manager of public relations for Amana. "Up until now, manufacturers have not recommended popping ordinarly popcorn in a microwave oven. Our new Radarange has a concentrator base supporting the bottom of a 3 qt. covered cone. This base focuses microwave energy at the bottom of the cone to pop kernels fast — without shaking or stirring. The concentrated energy is strong enough to pop the kernels quickly. As kernels pop to the top of the cone, unpopped corn settles to the bottom where it is heated and eventually popped."

Since oil isn't needed for popping, popcorn made in the Radarange has fewer calories and no added cholesterol — plus there's no greasy container to clean, Streicher points out. Sells for \$29,95.
