Old fashioned charm combines with modern engineering in the new pull chain water closet from Wellslake Industries.





COMPLETELY IMMERSIBLE IN WATER

"Potscrubber" Cleans Dirty Pots, Pans

"No need to ever again face the drudgery of cleaning up dirty pots and pans. Potscrubber will do it for you," says H and S Distributors about the new electric hand-held scouring device that's completely immersible in water without danger of electrical shock. It can be fitted with interchangeable scouring pads to scrub everything from fine enamel and teflon to ovens and grills. Works with all scouring powders, liquids, and detergents.

Potscrubber plugs into a standard electrical outlet and transforms the current down to 12 volts. The airtight and watertight cord and appliance are waiting for approval of Underwriters' Laboratories, but says the manufacturer, this approval "is only a matter of time."

The electric scrubber retails for \$39.95 and is being sold nationwide by various mail order houses. The manufacturer expects it to be marketed soon by several large chain stores.

KEROSENE AND LP-FIRED MODELS AVAILABLE

Refrigerator-Freezer Cools Food With Fire

In remote areas and in buildings not wired for electricity, there's nothing else that does the job, says Max Robinson, representative of the Dometic Sales Corp., about his company's kerosene and LP-fueled refrigerator-freezers.

Model RAK 100 refrigeratorfreezer, with 3.7 gal. kerosene storage capacity, is 24 in. square and 64 in. high. It features 2.5 sq. ft. of freezer space and a fresh food compartment. Robinson says a full 3.7 gal. of fuel will operate the refrigerator for about three weeks under normal conditions. The LP-fired unit runs off any LP source.

The fuel-fired cooling units are operated on the principle of absorption, which means the flame is used to heat a mixture of hydrogen and ammonia. The ammonia evaporates and runs through coils, absorbing heat from inside the refrigerator.

Dometic also has a line of kerosene and LP-gas chest-type freezers. Like the refrigerators, they compare favorably to conventional electric units, with all standard features and temperature controls.

Refrigerator-freezers retail at about \$700, and chest-type freezers at \$800.



Kerosene or LP-fueled Dometic refrigerator-freezers are completely silent, and have no moving parts to wear out. Doors are reversible to swing right or left.
